Flexi Staffing Industry

New Employment Growth QoQ (Q1 22-23)

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Staffing industry had a robust New Employment (Flexi) growth at 28% YoY (Q1 22-23 vs Q1 21-22)

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ISF Members added 2.33 lakhs New Formal Flexi Workforce in last four gtrs.

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Q123 grew at 6.6% witnessing another steady increase at +2.4% QoQ with 66000 new flexi employment created in Q123

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ISF Members represent 1.29 mn Formal Flexi Workforce Q123

YoY (Q123 vs Q122): Staffing industry grew at 28% YoY

- The markets reopening post Covid wave 3.0 in Q1 2022-23 had much sharper flexi employment demand, with YoY witnessing new employment growth at **28%.** This sharp growth comes from the factor as Q121-22 (last year) the industry was able to persist through the Covid wave 2.0 at 1.6%. The growth between Last four Qtrs thus has been significant.
- Nett headcount growth for staffing Industry (represented by ISF members) in the last 4 gtrs, has grown at **2.33 lakhs** indicating the significant new employment demand across sectors.
- General Staffing, that is employing from sectors like ecommerce, retail, manufacturing, BFSI, witnessed a very high demand.
- IT Staffing saw a more normalized approach to new employment creation compared to previous guarters, more so due to the external factors impacting the employment sentiment for the industry.

Q123: QoQ Staffing industry grew at 6.6%

- Q123 (Apr-Jun 2022) jumped +2.4% up from Q422
- ISF members have provided employment to 66000 new job seekers in Q123.



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General Staffing Industry witnessed a sharp growth at 28.3% YoY (Q1 22-23 vs Q1 21-22)

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General Staffing industry contributed with new employment growth at 7% growth in Q123. This is a sharp +2.8% higher than previous Qtr New Employment Growth

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ISF members added 2.21 lakhs new employment across General staffing roles in last rolling YoY. There is a significant 66000 new employment generated in Q1.

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General Staffing Industry was primarily driven by demands from FMCG, Ecommerce, Manufacturing, Retail, Logistics, Banking, Insurance, Infrastructure etc.

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
IT Staffing industry maintained its employment numbers with a minimal dip in Q1.
